# Insider's London

#### JUL 7, 2014: OVERNIGHT FLIGHT Depart from the USA.

JUL 8, 2014: LONDON Arrive in the bustling city of London. Relax, unpack, and become acquainted with your surroundings. Revisit London's iconic moments in film during a guided movie set walking tour that shows you locations around the city featured in popular movies accompanied by behind-the-scenes facts and trivia about the making of these films. (D) JUL 9, 2014: LONDON London's past and present come alive on this morning's sightseeing tour. Look skyward outside the Houses of Parliament for a view of the striking Big Ben, observe the pulsing heart of the city in Trafalgar Square and visit inside Sir Christopher Wren's mammoth St. Paul's Cathedral, an enduring symbol of London. Then enjoy a classic fish and chips lunch at the Tate Modern, included today instead of dinner. The afternoon is free to stroll the South Bank waterfront. Tonight enjoy a theater performance in London's famous West End. (B,L) JUL 10, 2014: LONDON All the world may be a stage, but to get an authentic feel of Shakespeare's theater it is essential to visit the reconstructed Globe Theatre. Attend a workshop, conducted by actors, that introduces you to both the plays of Shakespeare and the conditions in which Elizabethan actors worked. Then journey outside of London to visit Windsor Castle, the official residence of the reigning British monarch, Queen Elizabeth II. (B,D)

JUL 11, 2014: LONDON This morning's early start brings you to the Tower of London to witness the pageantry of the Opening Ceremony followed by time to explore. Then enjoy the Monarchy by bike tour around Hyde Park and St. James's Park. Starting at Kensington Palace, home to the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge, pedal your way past many notable buildings and monuments linked to England's royal history and learn their stories. This evening mystery, murder and mayhem are the themes during a Jack the Ripper Walking Tour. A one-day Tube pass is included today to help you explore the city with ease. (B,D)

JUL 12, 2014: LONDON Travel to Bath where a sightseeing tour shows you the Royal Crescent, the architecturally striking Circus, Pulteney Bridge, the Abbey and the famous Roman Baths built by legionnaires under Emperor Claudius. Then draw on your new knowledge of the city during a Culture Quest. Afterward partake in a favorite English pastime, traditional cream tea. Continue to the mysterious circles of Stonehenge, where sunrise rites are said to have occurred more than 4,000 years ago, before returning to London. (B,D)

JUL 13, 2014: LONDON Today take a full day tour through the enchanting Cotswolds, visiting medieval Warwick Castle, Shakespeare's Stratford upon Avon and a walk through the cobbled streets of Oxford. Note - Please be at the hotel concierge by 750am for your 8am departure. (B,D) JUL 14, 2014: LONDON Journey downriver to Greenwich aboard a Thames Clipper this morning.
