## trip itinerary - 10 days

#### Jul 11, 2016: Overnight Flight

Depart from the USA.

#### Jul 12, 2016: Athens

Welcome to Athens. Meet your tour manager and begin to explore the bustling Plaka. (D)

#### Jul 13, 2016: Athens

Travel back in time to ancient Greece this morning. Sightseeing with a local guide features the spectacular Acropolis and its largest temple, the Parthenon, which stands as a powerful and impressive memorial to the remarkable civilization that built it. You will also enjoy a visit to the Acropolis Museum to see masterpieces of ancient Greek art. This afternoon follow in the footsteps of the many notable philosophers, politicians and writers of the ancient world who called Athens home as you explore the city. In the evening you may opt to take a traditional Greek dancing lesson before enjoying an authentic Greek Taverna dinner and a chance to join in the dancing. (B,D)

#### Jul 14, 2016: Overnight Ferry

Drive to mystical Delphi, home to the great oracle of Apollo. Explore the Archaelogical Museum of Delphi and visit the Temple of Apollo, whose ruins date from the 4th century BC. Continue to Patras to board your overnight ferry. (B,D)

#### Jul 15, 2016: Sorrento

Awaken amidst the waters of the Mediterranean as you cruise toward Italy. Land and travel through the olive groves of the southern region to Pompeii. With a local guide giving commentary via personal headsets, explore the ancient city left perfectly preserved after Mount Vesuvius' eruption engulfed it in ash in 79 AD. Continue to the Sorrento region for the night. During your travels through Italy, gain an appreciation for the flavors of local cuisine through an Italian food challenge led by your tour manager. (B,D)

#### Jul 16, 2016: Sorrento

Enjoy a day to explore the citrus groves and waterfront of Sorrento. Or you may choose an optional excursion to the fabled island of Capri where you can enjoy picturesque views of the sea as you wander through twisting lanes and shop in the tiny artisan stores that line the square. (B,D)

#### Jul 17, 2016: Rome

Drive north to Rome this morning and immerse yourself in a city rich in history and culture as you begin to explore its fountains, Baroque façades and charming piazzas. After dinner join your tour manager for a stroll through the lively Piazza Navona and to gaze up at the magnificent Pantheon, at once an ancient temple and functioning Roman Catholic Church. (B,D)

#### Jul 18, 2016: Rome

Today's sightseeing tour introduces you to Rome's history with a panoramic drive of the city. In addition, your local guide accompanies you through the Vatican Museums, including the



Sistine Chapel, and continues to St. Peter's Basilica, giving commentary via personal headsets. Then enjoy a visit inside the iconic Colosseum. (B,D)

#### Jul 19, 2016: Rome

Today why not visit the tranquil Borghese Gardens or the shops of Via Condotti? Climb each of the seven hills, or visit some of the majestic churches such as Santa Maria Maggiore. Be sure to sample the gelato. One of the best spots for that is Piazza Navona. (B,D)

#### Jul 20, 2016: Departure

Depart for the USA. Optional Extensions and Extra Nights: Further immerse yourself in the culture and wonders of la dolce vita with an extra night in Rome, including the services of your ACIS Tour Manager. (B)


